## Changes to Single Sign On (SSO)

You may have noticed that versions of SSO have been deployed with new features to enhance user logon capabilities and improve site security.

Many employees use their campus or agency identity credentials to logon to campus-based applications, including student information systems, online teaching services, and parking permits. SSO now accepts campus or agency credentials from a few System Members, with plans to later expand the function to all System Members.

What this means to you:

- ◆ The [SSO logon page](#) has been redesigned to include logon links for participating campuses/agencies.
- ◆ You can choose to logon using your campus/agency credentials or, as before, with your UIN.
- ◆ During the initial pilot phase, employees using the [Texas A&M University NetID](#) or [Corpus Christi Island ID](#) will be able to use the new logon functions.



It also means that before using Examity for the first time, all pertinent information will be imported into the system for you, including class enrollment.

Examity is **fully transparent**. Feel free to track when students take tests and review video recordings from any test session. Examity will provide you with incident reports if a student is caught cheating.

## Enrollment Management Update

As of November 19, 2014, comparing like days, the **spring 2015 enrollment was 8,458 students**. This represents an increase of 6.1%. Currently, for fall 2015, our total applications are at 4,457 which represents a 6.3% increase compared to last year same time. We have admitted 1,221 students for the fall 2015 semester which represents an increase of 14.7% compared to last year same time. We have received 4,205 first-time in college (FTIC) applications which represents a 7.3% increase compared to last year same time. We have admitted 1,192 FTIC students which represents a 16.7% increase compared to last year same time.
